The Criminal Justice Department invites applications for a full time (9-month), non-tenure track Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice to begin in August 2022. We are seeking candidates who will work collegially and effectively with faculty, students, staff, administrative colleagues, alumni, and professional communities serviced by the Social Science Area. The Criminal Justice major is among the most popular with the College, and is the largest major within the Social Science Area, which offers majors in Criminal Justice, Political Science, Psychology, and Social Work plus minors in Criminal Justice, Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology.

The successful candidate will:

- teach a variety of undergraduate courses in Criminal Justice (e.g., Introduction to Criminal Justice; Police, Law, and Society; Criminal Law and Investigation)
- supervise undergraduate capstone projects and internships
- engage in academic advising of students
- support student recruitment efforts
- collaborate with colleagues to maintain the rigor of the program while incorporating continuous program improvement
- participate fully in program assessment
- engage in scholarly activity
- provide service to the department, the College, the community, and the profession; and
- complete other duties as assigned.

Preferred requirements include: While not all applicants may meet all preferred qualifications, the ideal candidate will bring many of the following:

- terminal degree in criminal justice, criminology, sociology, or a justice-related discipline from a regionally accredited institution is preferred, but applicants who are ABD/in-process or have a master's degree in the aforementioned disciplines plus relevant field experience will be considered
- prior criminal justice professional experience in law enforcement, or other justice-related areas
- evidence of ability and commitment toward diversity, equity, social justice, and inclusion
- evidence of excellent interpersonal communication skills.

Desired characteristics include:

- a specialization related to social justice, conflict resolution, or diversity
- a commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching in a career-oriented liberal arts setting
- readiness for college service, including academic advising and building the program in collaboration with the Social Science Area
- experience with building partnerships with members of (local) law enforcement, legal, and social justice communities
